

Missional Multiplier

In our movement, the position of a Missional Multiplier is one of our most valued positions amongst student leaders. It requires Gospel motivation, a walk dependent on the Spirit, humility, holy lifestyle, and personal initiative in the face of opposition & adversity—Acts 7.

Missional – The Oxford English Dictionary defines "missional" as: "Relating to or connected with a religious mission; missionary." In contemporary usage "missional" the adjective form of "missionary." Both words are related to "missio" (Latin: sending), "missional" focuses on the church contextualizing its methods, morality, and message to fit its indigenous culture without compromising.

Multiplier – one that multiplies, intensifying an effect, cause to increase greatly in number or effect. Matt 28:18-20, 2 Tim 2:2

**Every student should, at the very least, be living missionally.
What this looks like is -**

- Having intentional meals/coffee with classmates, work associates, neighbors and family initiating spiritual conversations trusting God for a Gospel opportunity.
- Invite same people into the body, the church and CRU events,
- Join other groups associated with a hobby, interest, or major and spending time to create relationships with the intent of having spiritual conversations.
- Living missionally but also involved in ministry mode evangelism for sharpening and practice for natural mode scenarios.
- Contextualizing your conversations to fit the moment.
- Praying for leading of the Holy Spirit.

There are certain individuals that are Missional Multipliers (M&M) –

- M&M's are faithfully attempting the above missional lifestyle and also multiplying that lifestyle in the lives of others to raise up missionally minded students for the movement.
- M&M's disciple key students so that they are multiplying a missional lifestyle into others' lives.
- M&M's are disciplined by Staff members or other student leaders.
- M&M's do not necessarily lead a bible study, but they are actively inviting students to a bible study where they connect with those that attend.
- M&M's help the person they are leading to identify a particular group on campus and help them live missionally themselves within the context of that identified group. Luke 10:1-10.
- M&Ms go to retreats and conferences to be a part of the spiritual growth and discovery that takes place at those kinds of events—for themselves and the people they are ministering to.
- Pray and fast for emerging MM's and areas of focus.

To summarize: Missional Multipliers are committed to living missionally, in the power of the Holy Spirit, while intentionally multiplying their heart and lifestyle into other students who will build into the movement at CPP and ultimately the body the Christ.

How M&Ms relate to campus wide outreaches?

- M&Ms may be part of the outreach planning and organizing.
- Use every avenue of influence to get students to the campus wide outreach to hear the Gospel and be exposed to the body of Christ
- M&M's actively follow up those who showed interest, with a priority on those that the M&M already has relationships with.

Practical things for the fall... and beyond:

- Go to the Back to School Retreat (September 19-20th)
- Meet and greet freshmen at Bronco Fusion, the Pizza Feed and other Welcome Week activities.
- Call contact cards at the C.R.U.D Night (Cru Dinner) and make appointments to share the gospel and invite them to activities and Bible studies
- Go to and invite people to the socials
- Plan on going to the Fall Retreat (October 17-19th)
- Go and invite students to the large group bible studies (i.e. the Thursday at 5 spot)
- Do classroom surveys during the first couple weeks of fall quarter to surface Christians or spiritually interested people—in order to develop potential leaders and/or to share the gospel.
- Plan on going to the Winter Conference (December 28th-January 1st).
- Plan on going to the Spring Break Trip (during spring break).
